Students are requested to attend the program and make the session a success.

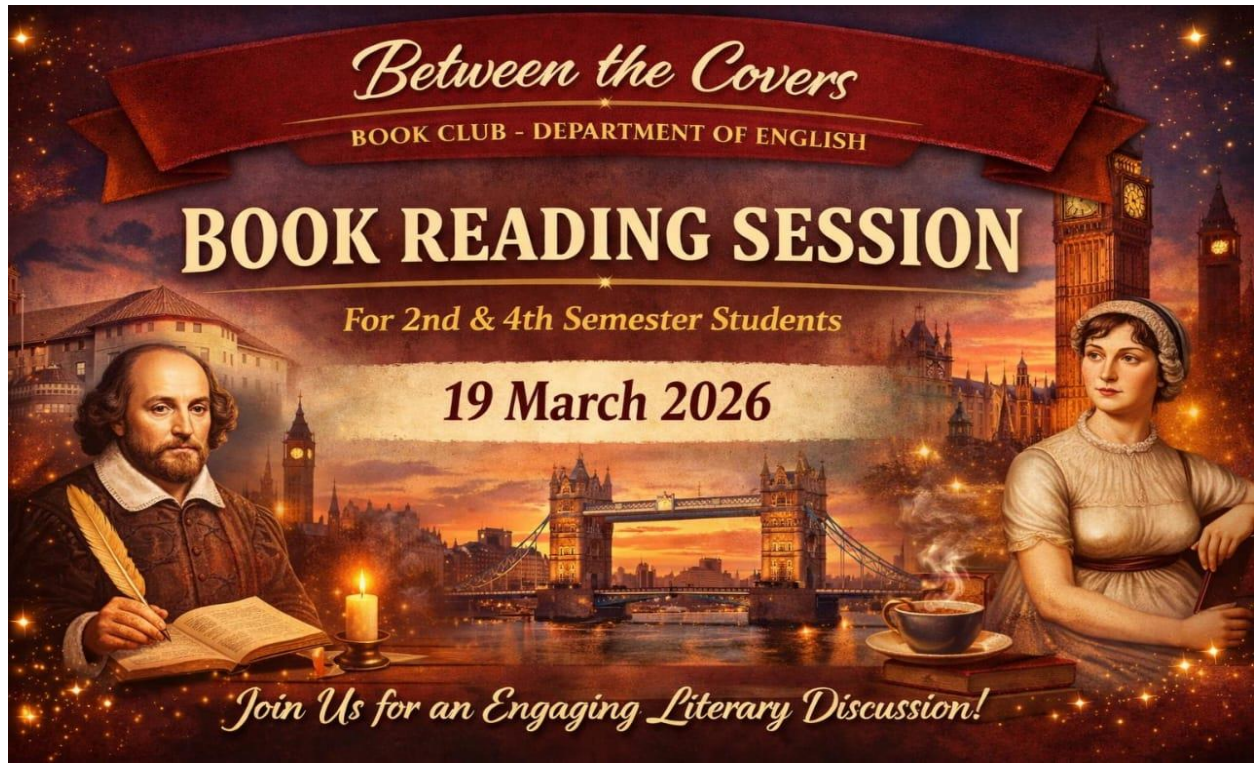
